February 24, 1932 Named Date for Carroll County's Primary

Wednesday, February 24, was set as the date of the Carroll County Primary and March 2 as the date of the run over primary at a meeting of the Carroll County Democratic Executive Committee Tuesday afternoon.

Much discussion was had concerning the new method of voting under the Australian Ballot System. It was pointed out that this system will necessitate additional expense and a increased number of managers to hold the election in the larger precincts.

J. Harvey Beall was re-elected Chairman of the Committee and Harvey H. Tisinger was chosen as Secretary.

The public is manifesting increasing interest as the time approaches for the qualified voters of Carroll to go to the polls and cast their ballots. With the exception of a very few, all officials of the county will face opposition for re-election.

The schedule of entrance fees for the various county offices was set by a sub-committee. The fees; Commissioner of Roads and Revenues, \$30.00; Ordinary, \$30.00; Clerk of the City Court, \$35.00; Sheriff, \$30.00 and Judge of the City Court, \$30.00.

1904– The first school transportation system in the State was started at the Temple Model School. It consisted of four horse drawn wagons.

1905– The Georgia High School Association had its beginning in Temple.

1946 – The Temple Theater opened.

1950– The community raised 24 tons of pimento peppers.

1977– Interstate I-20 was opened through Temple.

1993 – Celebrates 100 years.

In 1942 the Cramer Dental Clinic was opened at 624 Newnan Street. You will notice a plaque on the building honoring his mother, Mrs. J.E. Cramer for whom the clinic was dedicated. The building was originally built in 1941. Over the years additional rooms were added to the side and rear of the original building.

Dr. Selby Cramer was born 9 Mar 1897 in Georgia and died 11 Oct 1980 in Carrollton Georgia. He was married to Nell M. Hale, born 3 Aug 1990 and died 19 Aug 1982 in Carrollton Georgia. They are both buried in the Carrollton City Cemetery. The couple had two daughters, Connie Cramer Malone and Nancy Cramer Jones and one son, David Cramer.

Dr. Cramer was a well known Dentist in the Carrollton Area, practicing for 50 years. He was a Honorable Fellow and Life Member of the Georgia Dental Association, member of Phi Omega Dental Fraternity, Fifth District Dental Society and American Dental Association.

Dr. Cramer was a former member of the staffs at Tanner Memorial Hospital, Bremen Hospital, and Villa Rica Hospital, He was a charter member of the Carrollton Rotary Club and a member of the First Baptist Church where he was a former Sunday School Teacher and Boy Scout Leader.

Rev. Zack Hayes, minister of the First Methodist Church in Carrollton. Rev. Hayes was born 2 Feb 1902 in Elberton Georgia and died 22 Jun 1988 in Gainesville Georgia. He was married to Miss. Sara Thompson, born 27 Nov 1907 and died 13 Feb 2003. She is buried with her husband in the Oxford Historical Cemetery in Newton County Georgia. They had two sons, Zach Clark Hayes III and Abbott Swift Hayes.

Dr. Howell Phillip Bell, beloved former pastor of the First Baptist Church of Carrollton. Dr. Bell served Baptist pastorates in Georgia for 44 years before his retirement. Born 19 Jun 1885 and died 30 May 1959. He married Miss. Katherine Sammons, born 23 Jun 1886 and died 22 Nov 1969. They are both bur-
